

Appleby-In-Westmorland Town Council Precept Report 2022/23

What is a Precept?

Appleby Town Council forecasts how much money it is going to need for the following year to run the Council's services and maintain the buildings.

This is then divided by the **number of properties** in the parish that fall into **Band D** Council Tax bands. This figure is adjusted to take account of such things as exempt properties and planned new houses to get the precept each Council Tax payer in the parish will contribute.

What is the CTRS and does it affect the Council Tax base?

Council Tax Reduction Scheme. When EDC calculate the tax base, a property which is exempt from Council tax is not included. If a property has a 50% discount it is counted as half a property.

A lower Council Tax base in Appleby means each household pays a higher amount towards the precept.

How much will I pay in 2022?

ATC have set the precept for 2022/2033 at £135,980 .
Divide this by the number of households, 1106.63 =
£122.87 annually for a Band D property and **£10.23 per month**.

How does this compare to last year?

Last year you paid £9.00 per month and this year you will be paying £10.23 per month.

What's that figure in %?

13.7% more than 2021-22

WOW! This seems high?

In % terms it does but in reality is it a difference of £1.23 per month, £14.76 per year, unwelcome but necessary.
